Abu Simbel Several sites of outstanding world heritage were moved from Aswan to higher ground when the dam became operational. The incredible temples of Abu Simbel to the south are one such example.

The Red Sea Boasts superb diving and snorkelling in the warm coral-filled waters, and the main highlight in the Sinai is St Catherine's Monastery.
